								*Given the lack of common SLOs, I think we need more information in student learning outcomes. The first four ALAS "learning outcomes" from WNMU do not specify what students will do; rather, they promise what instructors will do, particularly in their assignments. The "Creativity Student Learning Outcomes" seem broad and don't appear measurable. For instance, I don't know how an instructor can measure success for understanding "how to engage with creativity in many different media." The authors might revise the outcomes to provide NMCAC with more specific outcomes. The narratives and final project are clear and supportive of the application.

This is, for all intents, a course only designed for Spanish majors, which seems to me to undermine the rationale behind "general education" courses. I don't believe this is a general enough course to be considered in the general education group. Public Speaking is generally a Gen Ed course but I feel that public speaking in Spanish is a layered course that requires specific knowledge/skills.
