Subject: [EXT] ALP in Teacher Affordability Question

Good morning,

This question is related to the Teacher Affordability program for teachers in the state of NM (funding Aug. 2019). Questions have arisen related to the funding provision for Alternative Licensure Program candidates who are teaching on an alternative license through PED but who also take several courses (anywhere from 3-6 hours generally, but rarely a clean "6" – sometimes 5 credits, or, at times, field experience, alone, which is 3 credits).

Questions

-Does Teacher Affordability apply to ALP candidates?

-Must they, if this is accessible to them, remain enrolled in 6 credits (which the rule defines as "Half-time status")– given the unique and complicated role they serve as a teacher of record, while taking courses?

-Could a specific feature in the rule be included that stipulates what process applies and how it applies to ALP candidates.
