



AP Credit Guide: College Course Equivalencies

The table below shows how AP exams can count for college credit at New Mexico's public colleges and universities. Students who earn a score of 3 or higher on an AP exam can receive college credit. Most courses listed are 3 credit hours, unless noted otherwise. Science courses that include a lab (marked with a "C") are 4 credit hours, and lab-only courses (marked with an "L") are 1 credit hour. In most cases, these courses also count toward General Education requirements at New Mexico public colleges and universities.
