

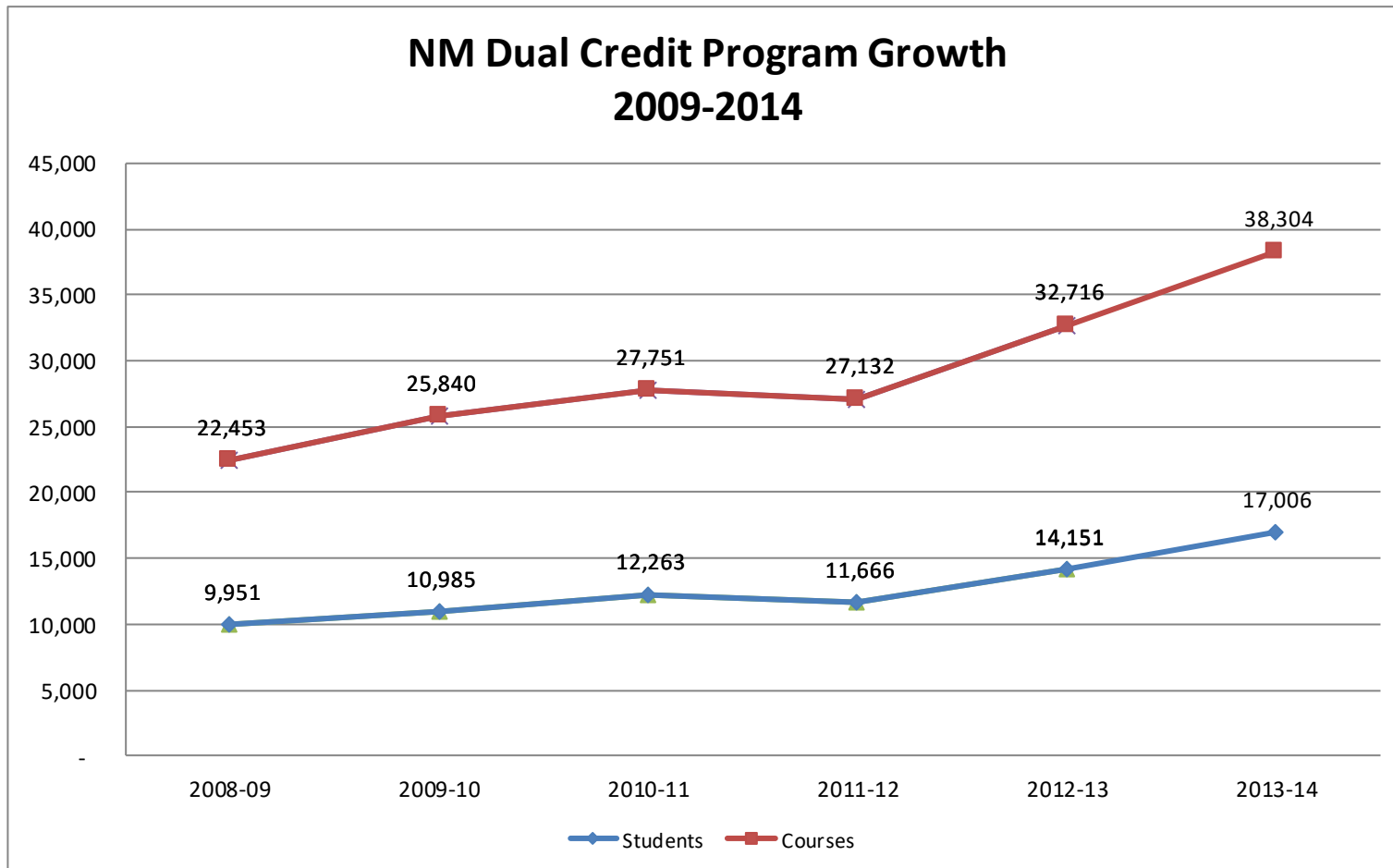

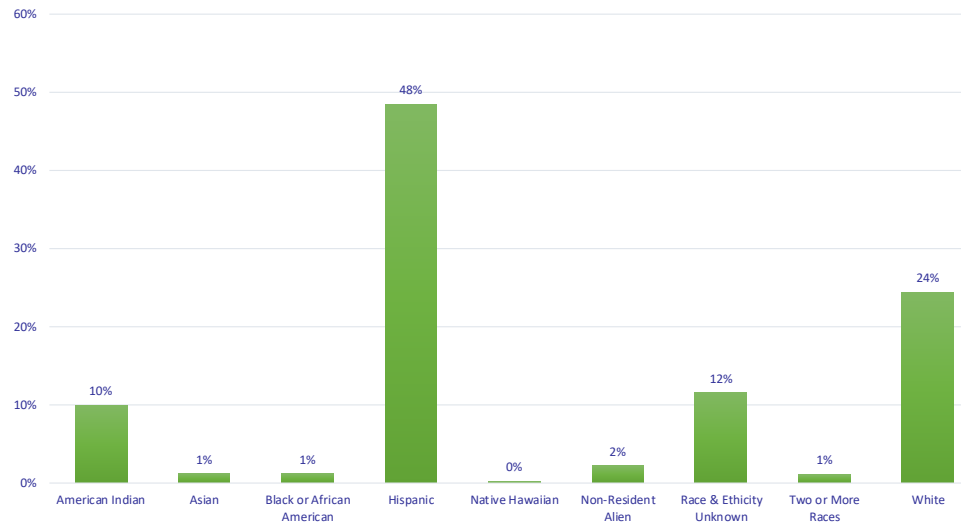
NM Dual Credit Program Growth

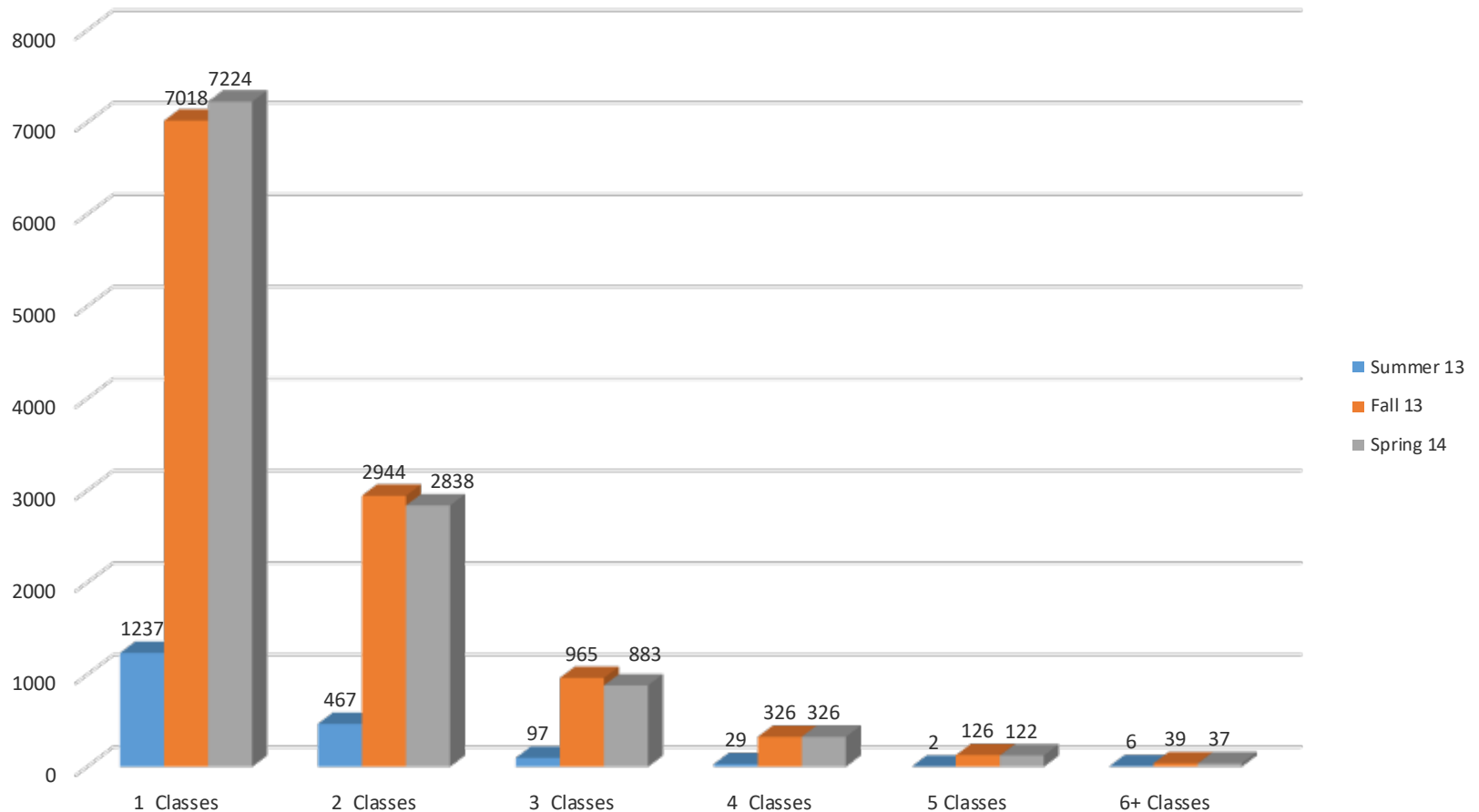

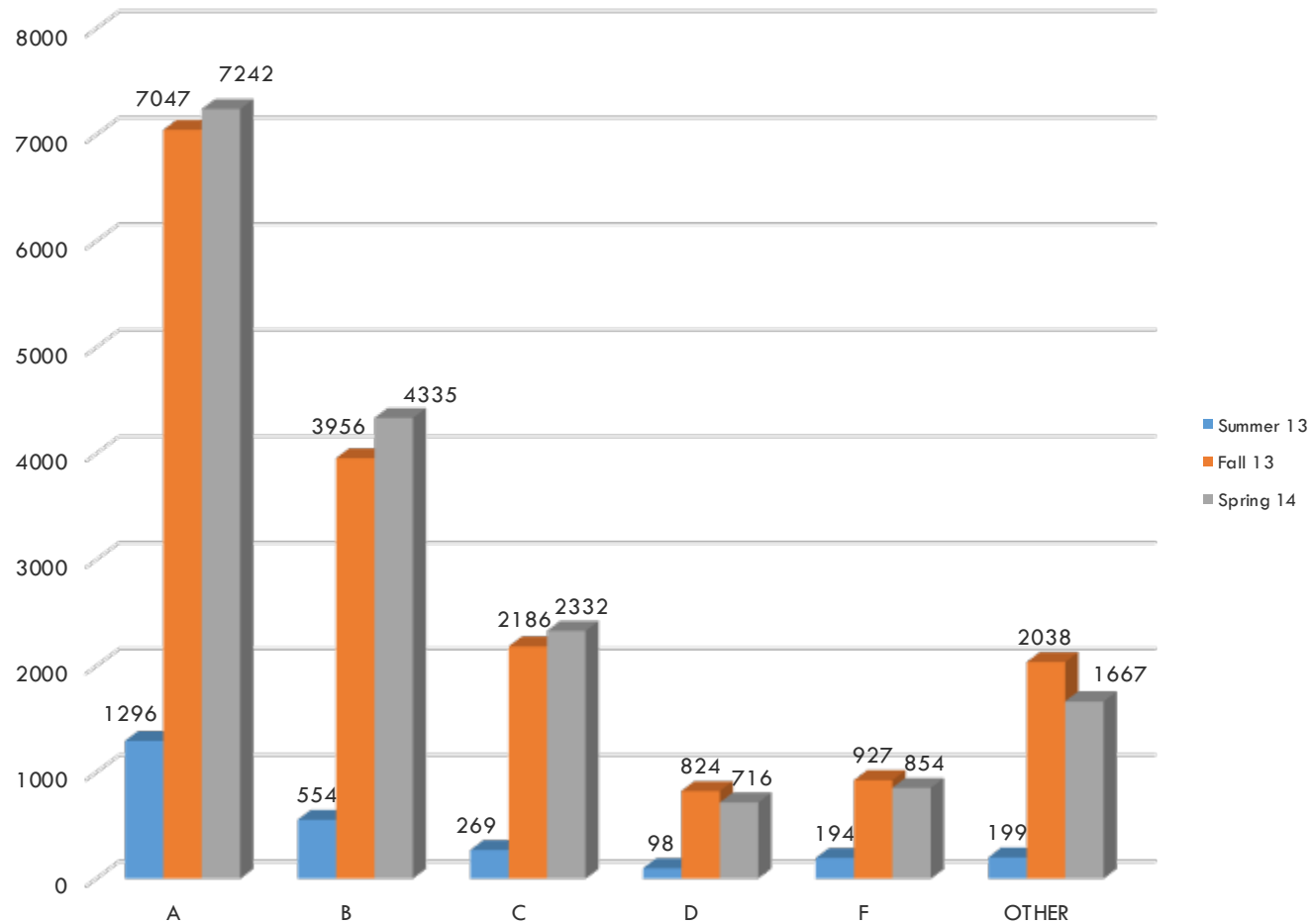
Number of Classes Taken AY13-14

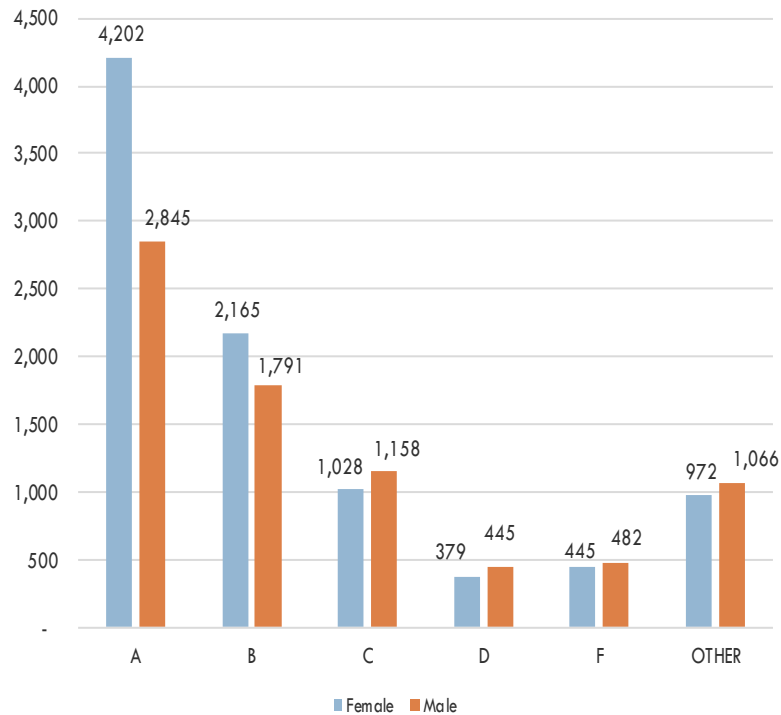

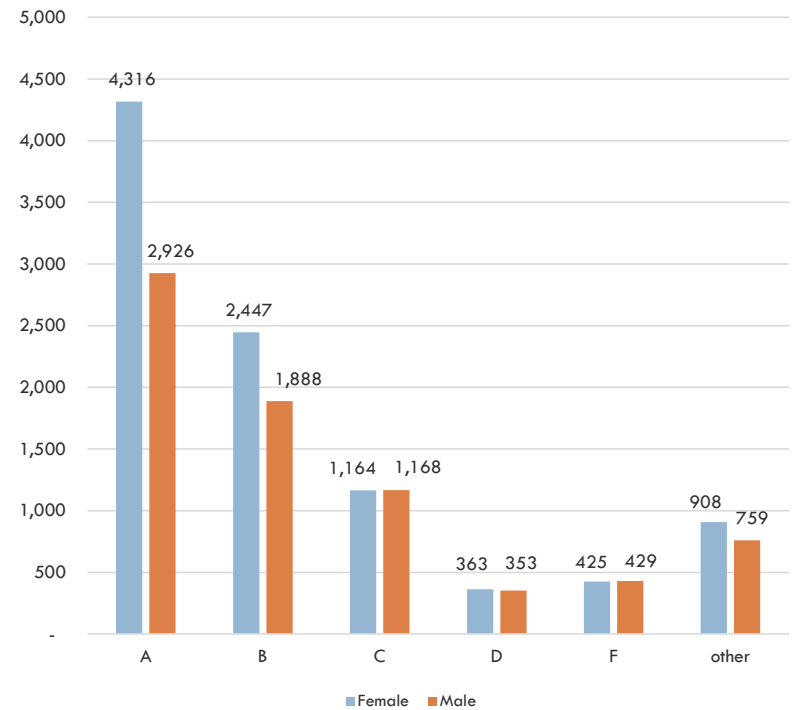
Course Grade Distribution by Gender

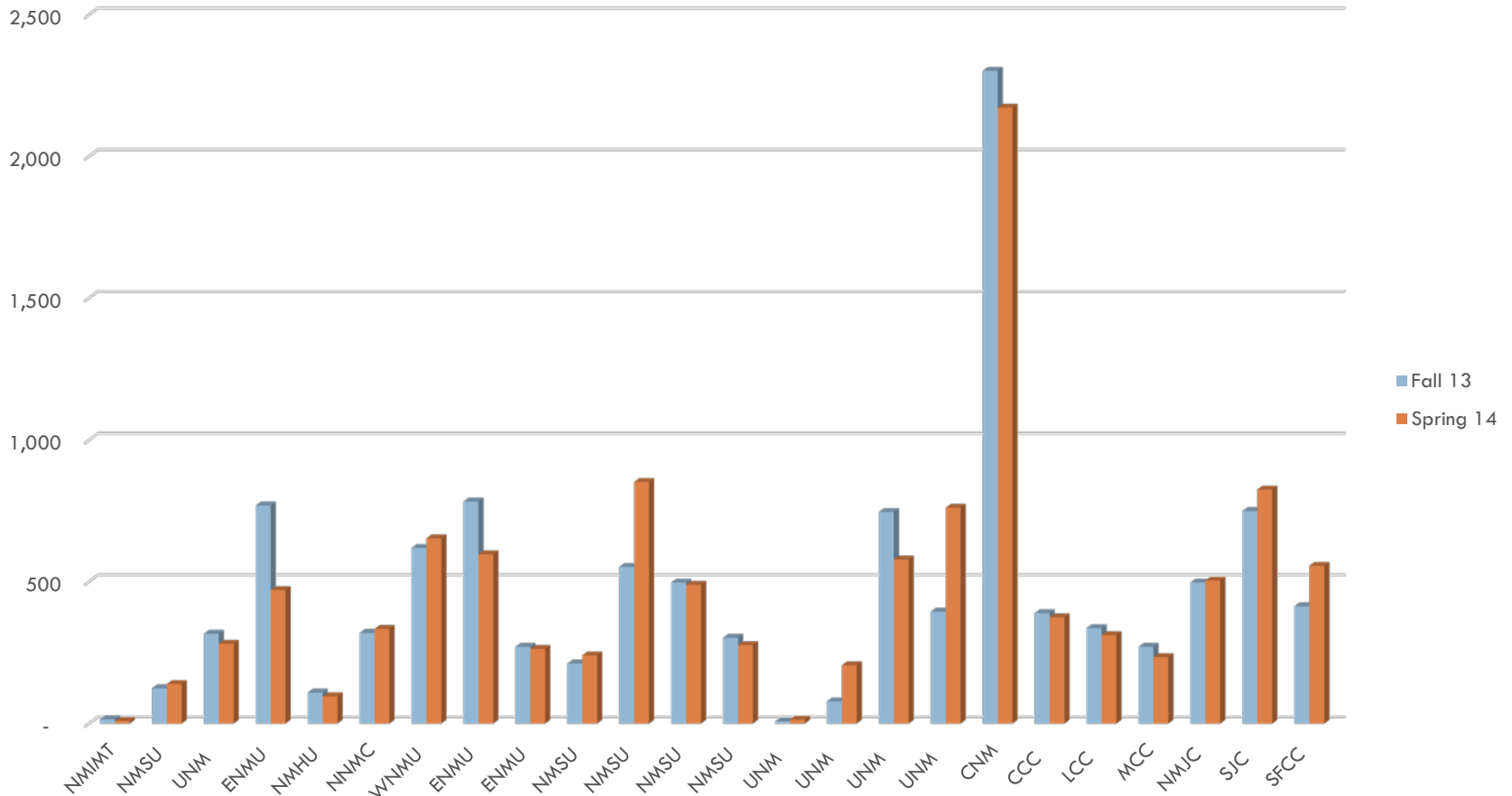

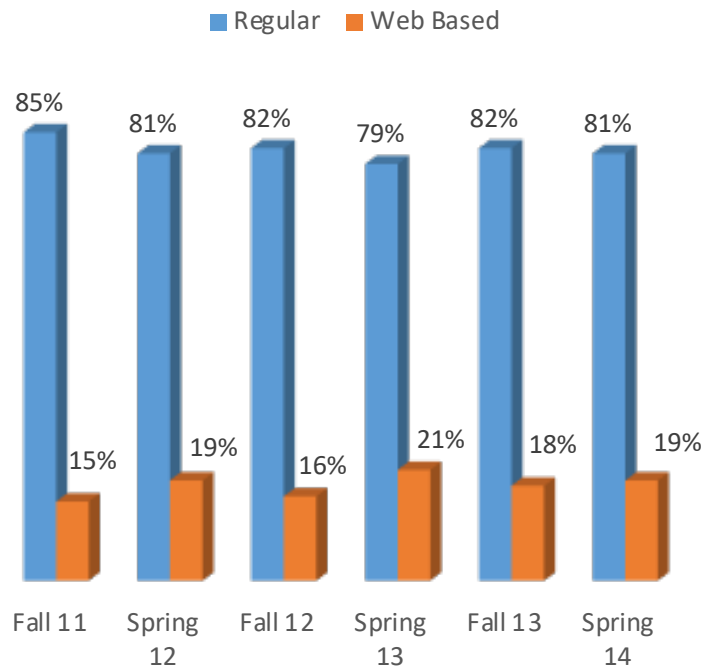

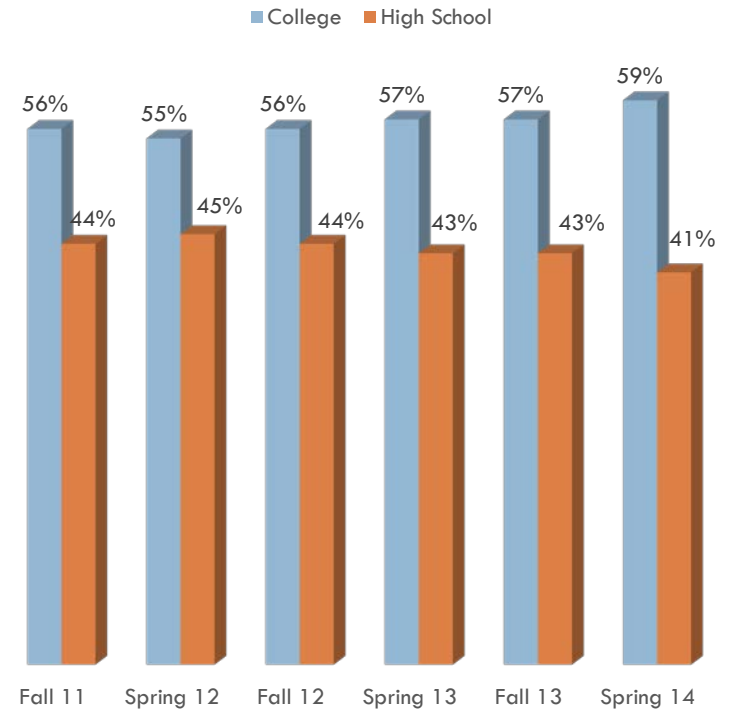
Course Delivery and Course Location
