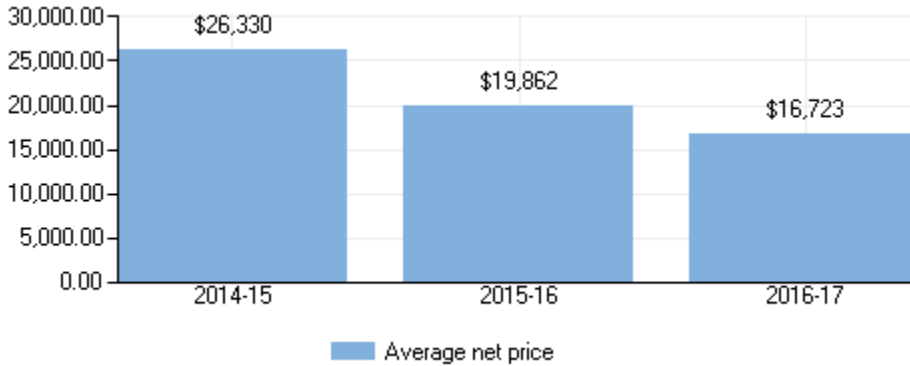

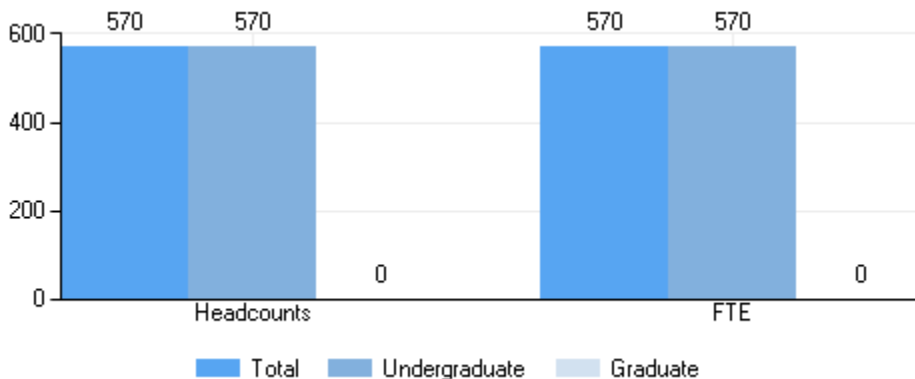

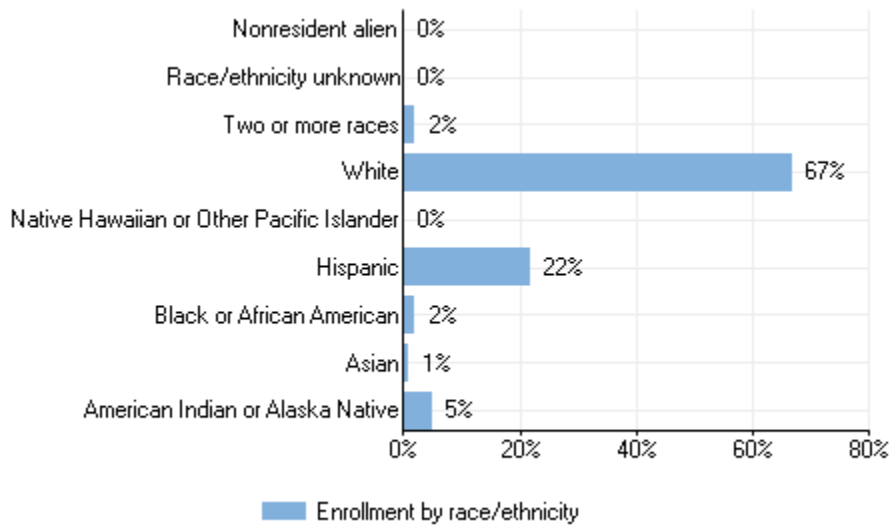
Unduplicated 12-month headcount and total FTE, by student level: 2017-18



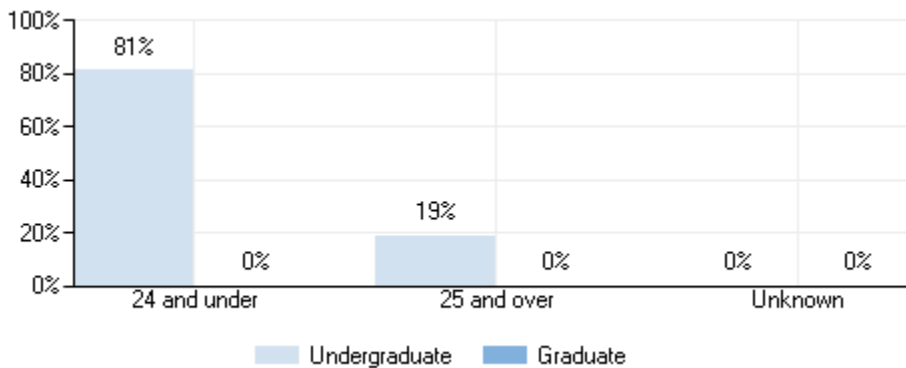

Percent of all students enrolled, by age: Fall 2017



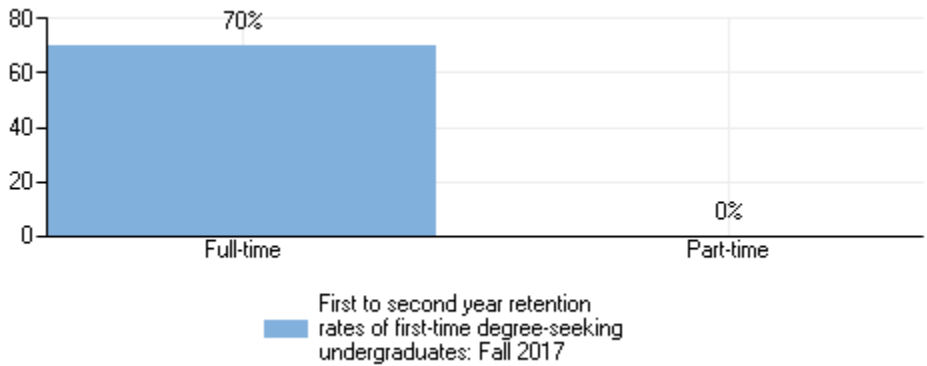
Enrollment by distance education: Fall 2017

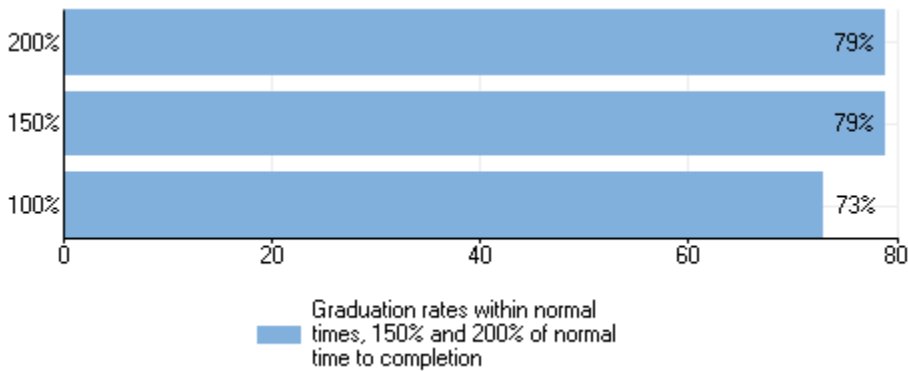

First to second year retention rates of first-time degree-seeking undergraduates: Fall 2017



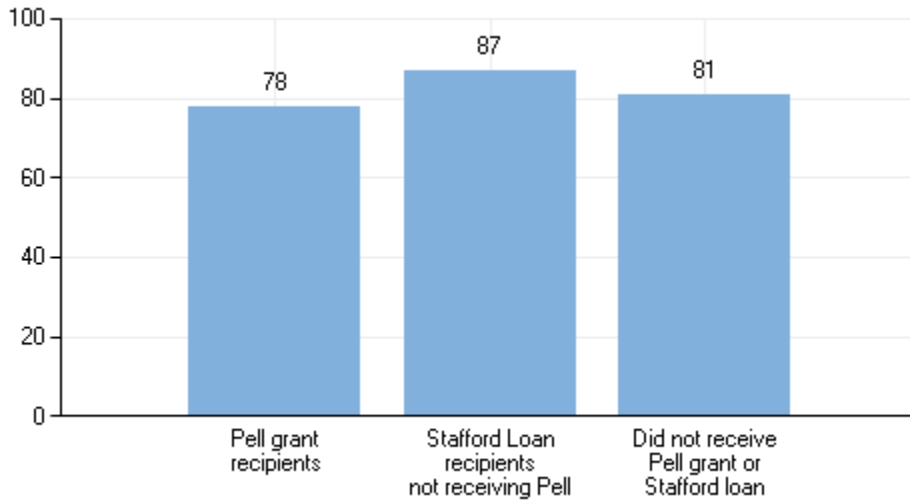
Graduation rates of full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates within normal time, and 150% and 200% of normal time to completion: 2013 cohort

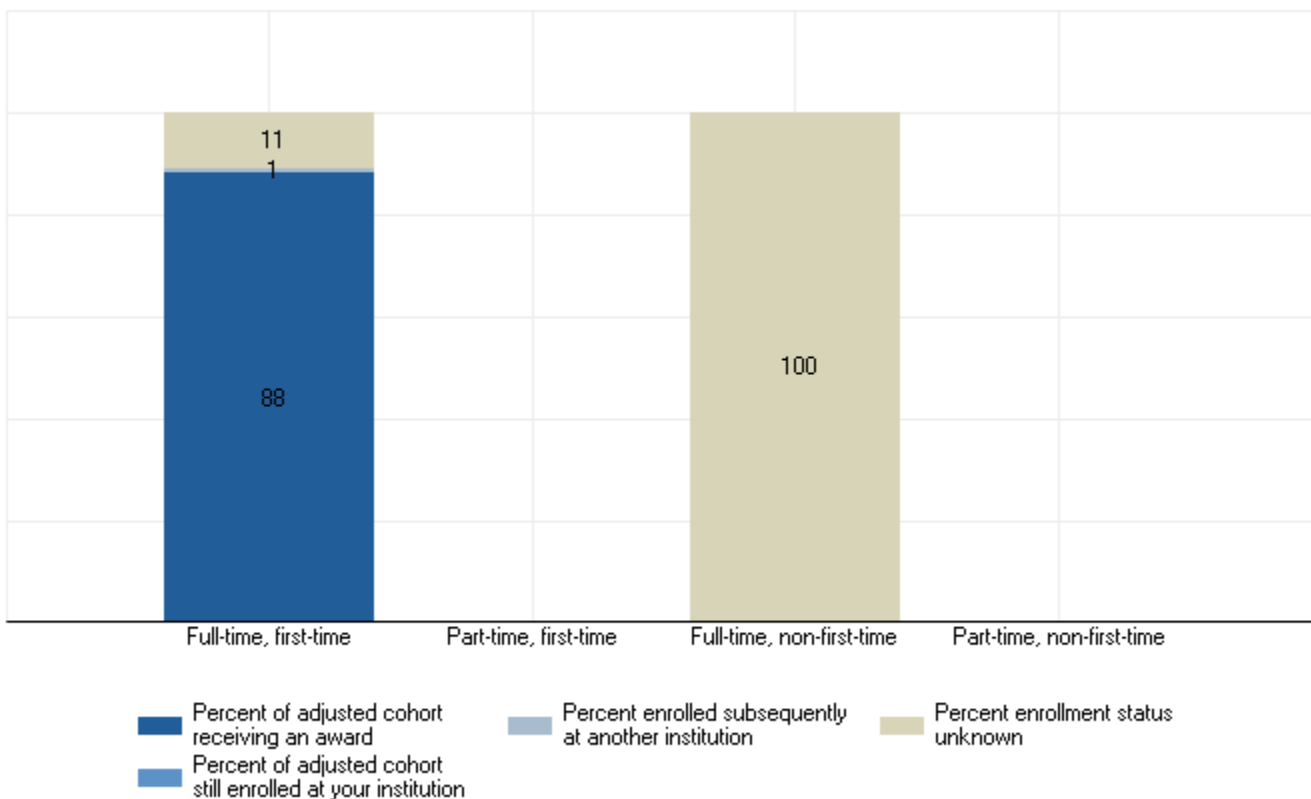
Graduation rates of full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates within 150% of normal time to program completion, by Title IV aid status: 2014 cohort

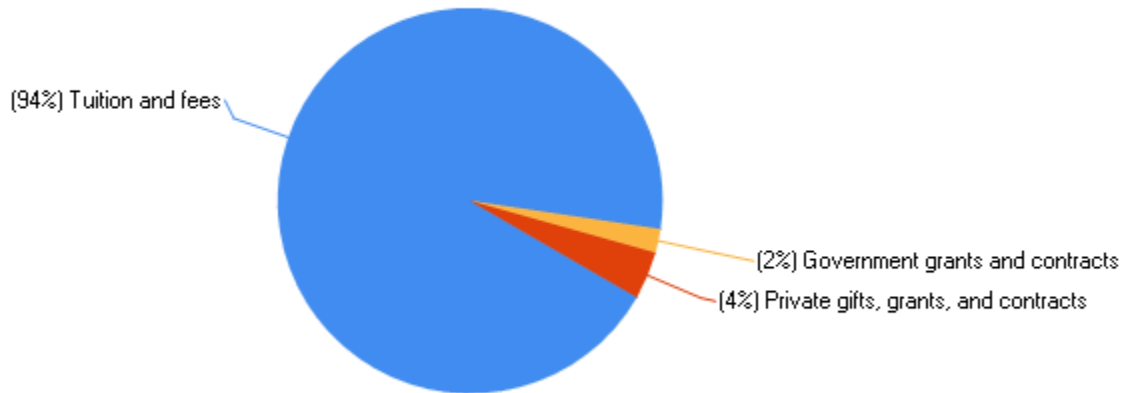

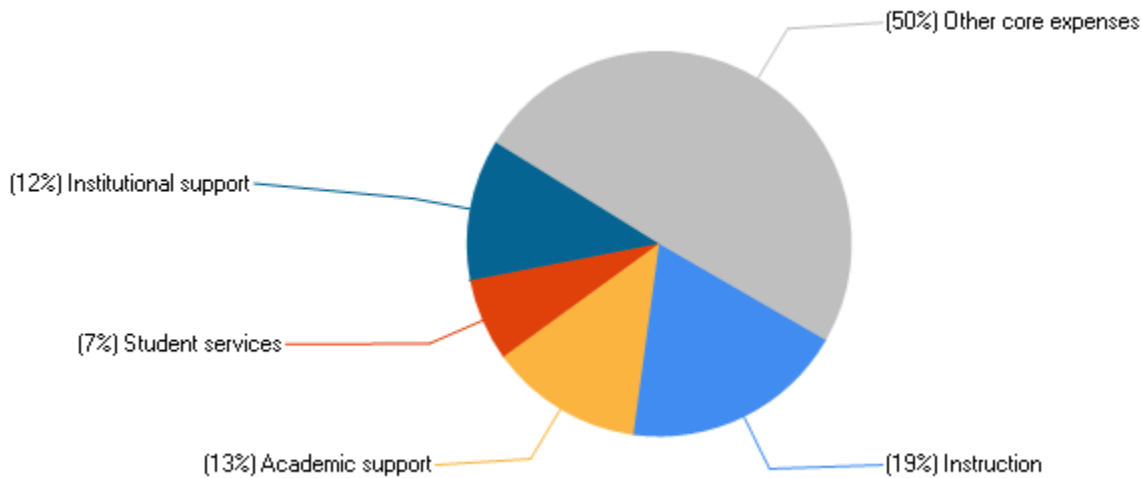
Percent distribution of core revenues, by source: Fiscal year 2017
